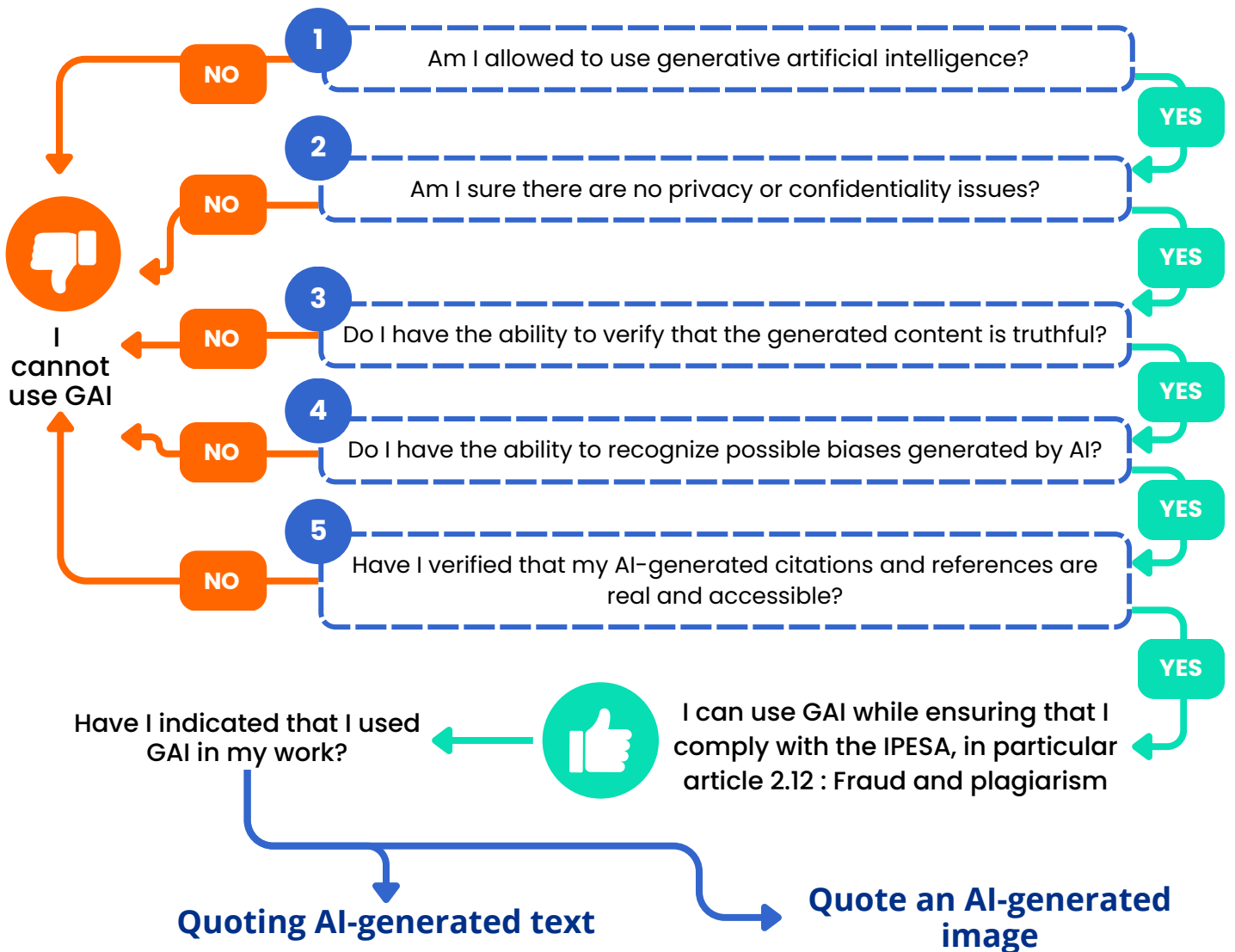


Tool for intergrated use of GAI



In a text:

In APA Style

(Author, Year).

E.g.: (OpenAI, 2021).

In traditional style, footnote

[1] AUTHOR, 'Title of document' in Robot name (artificial intelligence), date, URL address.

Ex. : [1] OPENAI, 'CÉGEP Library Survey,' in ChatGPT (artificial intelligence), November 13.

In a bibliography:

In APA style

Author. (year). Software Title (Version X) (Type of application or software). Publisher. URL

Ex. : OpenAI. (2023). ChatGPT (May 24 version) (Large language model). <https://chat.openai.com/chat>

In traditional style

AUTHOR, 'Document title', in Robot name (Artificial intelligence), Date, URL

Ex.: [1] OPENAI, 'CEGEP Library Survey' in ChatGPT (artificial intelligence), November 13, 2023, <https://openai.com/blog/chatgpt>

Rules for citing images created by AI tools are not yet well established in bibliographic standards. However, there are templates you can use to reference these images in your work. It is strongly recommended to include a logo to clearly indicate the use of AI.
